Street Scene

The street scene team have been working hard through the month servicing the bins and carrying out litter picking across the contract area. As is normal for this time of year we had staff off work using up remaining holidays before the end of the year, to ensure we keep on top of the rounds I have been using my commercial teams to assist to back fill holidays. Through the week leading up to Christmas I used all available staff on street scene, these guys carried out duties along the high streets and shop fronts, after these were completed, they went to hotspot areas.

We are still carrying one vacancy on the team, we have interviewed but as yet no suitable candidates have come through, I have to be selective as the job is physically demanding.

We had a skeleton crew in during Christmas week and I'm pleased to report that they had no issues or incidents during this time, they focused on the high streets 1st then moved on to the routes and rounds. The 29th was the worst day for them as there was 4 days to catch up on, with numerous bags fly tipped next to the bins in the usual places.

During the early part of the month one of the teams was working down Redcliffe St (Rodbourne) during the time on site they were approached by a member of public asking there was something that could be done about the red trade waste bins at the top of the road, these are difficult to get past and are attracting fly tipping (photos below)



The weights taken into the tip this month are as follows, general waste 9480kg, green waste 3680kg,

Grounds Maintenance

Through the early part of the month the grounds teams were working the shrubs and hedges through Penhill and have completed a lot work to a very good standard, where possible we are hitting back hard and more attention is being paid to small scrubby areas which are not mapped but look unsightly if left (in most cases these are self-set areas Brambles as such like) From the 18th onwards I used the GM teams to assist on street scene as mentioned previously

Once we return to normal service the teams will be all out on the rounds, as it stands, we are close to halfway through and can see no reason why we would not finish in good time for grass cutting.

On the 17th we finished the prep work on the planters along Morris Street, these have been weeded, dug over and topped up with fresh soil mixed with compost. We will turn the soil over to prevent weed growth periodically; we should be able to plant up through the latter part of May or early June.

As mentioned previously the last full working week of the year was spent carrying out street scene jobs so not much to report on for the latter part of December.
